



• In order to better serve its Members, the Economic Commission for Africa has opened, in 1963, representation in each one of the five sub-regions. Since then, to better reflect the changes introduced in the programme functions, these representations were successively renamed: Multinational Programming and Operational Centres (MULPOCs) in 1979; Sub-regional Development Centres in 1997; and ECA Offices in 2002.

 SROs provide essentially <u>capacity development</u> and <u>advisory services</u> to countries, regional economic communities and sub-regional development actors in relation to the various areas of focus, including toward formulating evidence-based plans and policies for economic, social transformation and regional integration among others; and support to the implementation of the Standing Operating Procedure of ECA's collaboration with the UN RC system.

Advance inclusive development in West Africa through strengthening countries' capacity to integrate challenges related to demographic dynamics into their policies and planning processes and achieve regional integration.

**Expand the** manufacturing and highvalue service sectors and increase the share of tradeable and manufactured goods in total exports, deepen regional value chains and improve the competitiveness and productivity of local economies in order to accelerate economic diversification and structural transformation in Central Africa.

Achieve deeper regional integration in East Africa by advancing the operationalization of the African Continental Free Trade Area, increasing intraregional investments, harnessing the blue economy, and enhancing regional tourism.

Deepen regional integration and strengthen capacities to achieve inclusive industrialization for the reduction of poverty and inequality in Southern Africa.
