Introduction and Context for ARFSD-10 & 11 (2024 and 2025)

ARFSD is mandated by the UN General Assembly and ECA Conference of Ministers

ECA-AUC-AfDB and UN annual Intergovernmental Multistakeholder Platform for advancing implementation of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063:

- Sustaining commitment
- Assessing progress against set milestones and
- Bolstering multi-stakeholder engagement and synergies, and promoting concerted efforts
- Identifying, promoting and building consensus on transformative actions, levers and partnerships to drive progress

With only 6 years left to 2030





- Globally, only 16% of the SDG targets are on track to be met by 2030.
- The remaining 84 per cent show limited progress or a regression of progress



- Africa is on track to achieve only 10 of the 144 measurable SDG targets by 2030
- Also in Africa, 106 targets require accelerated action while 28 are showing regression of progress



It is time to scale and speed up implementation of SDGs alongside Agenda 2063 Second Ten-year Implementation plan (2024–2033): Acceleration decade for A2063



Theme ARFSD-10: "Reinforcing the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and Agenda 2063 and eradicating poverty in times of multiple crises: the effective delivery of sustainable, resilient and innovative solutions".

Reviewed progress, challenges, and opportunities in the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063

With a Focus on of SDG 1 (no poverty), 2 (zero hunger), 13 (climate action), 16 (peace, justice and strong institutions) and 17 (partnerships for the Goals) and the corresponding goals of Agenda 2063, with a special focus on its second 10-year implementation plan.

- Enhanced knowledge and capacity of member States and other stakeholders and advocated effective and transformative interventions including policy measures and actions at the national, regional and global levels, to advance and accelerate implementation of SDGs and the goals of Agenda 2063;
- Served as Africa regional preparatory meeting for the 2024 HLPF to and Summit of the Future

 - 14 countries supported –[Chad, Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Guinea, Kenya, Libya, Mauritania, Mauritius, Namibia, Sierra Leone, South Sudan, Uganda, and Zimbabwe]
 - •All countries now countries covered with VNRs

Key Messages

From ARFSD-10

- Africa called for the Summit of the Future to be inclusive and ensure that Africa and the global South participate effectively and with a stronger voice in international governance and decision-making.
- The global financial architecture should be urgently reformed to make it fit for purpose and serve the interests of Africa and developing countries in the world.
- Redouble efforts to revitalize national frameworks and channel finance to accelerate integrated implementation of the 2030 Agenda and the Second 10-year implementation plan of Agenda 2063
- Policy environment for sustainable finance should be enhanced and innovations in climate finance should be fostered including through carbon markets, debt swaps and green and blue bonds.
- Take concrete actions to reap a demographic dividend from the youth bulge in Africa and Dramatically increase investments and expanding programmes and services in education, nutrition and health to empower all children and young people.
- The vast market provided by the African Continental Free Trade Area and the global climate agenda should be leveraged to sustainably harness the continent's natural resources, transform agriculture, boost food security, and drive sustainable industrialisation
- Statistical systems should be transformed and modernized to enhance access to quality disaggregated data by leveraging the digital revolution, artificial intelligence, and the high-impact initiative on the power of data.

- Strengthen the capacity for VNR for 10 participating African countries in 2025 (1. Angola 2.Eswatini, 3.Ethiopia, 4.Gambia, 5.Ghana, 6.Lesotho, 7.Nigeria, 8.Seychelles, 9.South Africa and 10.Sudan)
- To follow-up and take forward the outcomes of the Summit of the Future.
- To serve as Africa regional preparatory meeting for the 2025 HLPF to and the Second World Summit for Social Development, Qatar (4 to 6 November 2025).
